President's Message



Greetings to you fellow Mapuans and your families. My name is Ross Papilla, and I have the pleasure to serve as the new president of Southern California Mapua Alumni (SCMA) for 2021-2122. My fellow officers and I were inducted into office during the peak of the pandemic in January 2021.

A bit about myself. I belong to MIT EE Class 1975, graduating as Silver Medalist and Cum Laude. I taught in Mapua and worked briefly at NPC then joined the US Navy in 1976 to seek better opportunity for my siblings. After the Navy, I joined Southern California Edison in 1980 as an engineer and went up the ranks to senior management after a 25-year career, where I obtained my PE in Electrical Engineering and my Executive MBA from Claremont. After retirement, I formed an Engineering and Consulting group and led a high-performance team of engineers. I volunteered in many organizations, including St. Lorenzo Ruiz Catholic Church where I served in the Pastoral Council. It is this background and the mentorship of the past presidents, especially Glee Quinoveva Quiaot and

Nene Umali-Irlandez, that informs my approach to leading SCMA in an unchartered territory brought about by Covid-19.

Our term at SCMA started with a blessing of a talented set of mostly-young officers combined with a highly experienced group of former presidents serving as Directors and Advisers. With this team, we not only managed, but thrived during the pandemic. We had our monthly meetings on Zoom complemented by "team-building" outdoor excursions. We formed Committees with clear responsibilities. We created a "Revitalization Plan" to reinvigorate SCMA and reposition it for success going forward under the new normal. Surveys and analyses from this strategic plan resulted in a set of integrated initiatives, the most important of which included: (a) grow the membership, (b) grow our scholarship and education/career-assistance programs, (c) use technology to improve our operations, (d) establish new fund-raising methods, and (e) further our socialization programs to strengthen our bond as Mapuans.

We worked feverishly and completed our long-delayed "Website Project", which was done collaboratively with content from the new SCMA Officers, Advisers and Directors. Our new website is full of detailed information such as our history/mission/advocacy, scholarship and career-assistance programs, and alumni life activities; and useful functions, such as on-line membership application, electronic donations/payments, event invitations and RSVP's, sponsorship and advertising, downloadable documents, secure messaging, and links to our new social media platforms. I highly encourage you to visit our new website www.socalmapua.org to learn more and be an active part of this newly-vibrant association.

For improved work collaboration, we centralized our filing system in Dropbox, along with the appropriate file structure and access privileges. For a more efficient financial system, we expanded the use of on-line banking with enhanced security, and established new accounts on Zelle and Venmo to enable on-line payments. You may send money to SCMA via Zelle at treasurer.socalmapua@gmail.com and Venmo at @SouthernCalifornia-MapuaAlumni. We maintain our status as a non-profit 501(c)(3) charitable organization. We also created new social media accounts on Facebook and Instagram. Please "friend" Socal Mapua on Facebook and "follow" @Connect.Socalmapua on Instagram, and ask fellow alumni to do the same. All of these functions are accessible through our new website. www.socalmapua.org.

As you may know, we SCMA and MAASD (Mapua Alumni Association of San Diego), as chartered members of the National Association of Mapua Alumni (NAMA), were on tap to host the MapuaWorld 2023 event. After much deliberation, we decided to cancel our hosting of the

event (MapuaWorld 2021 was also canceled) due to the adverse impact of the Covid pandemic. MapuaWorld is a major biennial global alumni event that involves significant international travel, and we must prioritize safety. Also, the pandemic has curtailed our ability to raise funds and support the long planning and extensive logistics needed to host such an event. We hope that the virus would soon be under control, so that we can enjoy MapuaWorld 2025 in Manila at the 100-year anniversary of our beloved Alma Mater.

At this time, we are conducting a membership outreach that will culminate with the 2021 SCMA Annual Summer Family Picnic, which will be held at Suzanne Park in Walnut, CA on August 7 from noon to 5 PM. To ensure safety, our event has gone through the approval process of the City of Walnut as restrictions on gatherings have progressively been lifted. We would like to reach out to all Mapua Alumni, especially those who haven't heard of us before. Please be sure to attend and help spread the word, reaching out to alumni within your circle of friends and organizations that you belong to.

We are trying to position our association with the new realities, and we count on the support of all alumni members as we move forward. Much has been started, but much more still needs to be done. With your active participation and support, we hope to look back someday and say that the pandemic has revitalized Southern California Mapua Alumni.

Election of Officers

SCMA Team Building Hike One, April 17, 2021, Peter F. Schabarum Regional County Park, Rowland Heights, CA

The first-ever team building hike was attended and participated by SCMA 2021-2022 Officers, Members, & Family. This said Regional County Park is a 575 – acre facility with 75 acres of developed and popular spot for walking, hiking, picnics, youth camping, tennis, soccer and other amenities that everyone can enjoy. The SCMA Team went thru the Schabarum – Skyline Trail that runs through open spaces and flood control channels connecting communities from Covina to Whittier. It has the length of 29.94 miles, 8.92 feet average width, elevation gain of 1,138 feet. The trails provide access for commuters and recreational users to a variety of trails such as those in Peter F. Schabarum



Regional Park and Puente Hills Nature Preserve, as well as the Rio Hondo River and San Gabriel Trails. This trail offers scenic views of the San Gabriel Mountains and Los Angeles City skyline. After the hike, the group met up with Glory Montemayor, SCMA President 1983-84 and had lunch with another past SCMA President Edith Garcia-Ramos, 1999-2000.
