#### **President's Message:**

Greetings to you fellow Mapuans. I wish you and your families a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. As I mentioned in our July newsletter, we are in the process of revitalizing our organization with key objectives such as energizing and growing our membership, growing our scholarship and education/career-assistance programs, using technology to improve our operations, establishing new fund-raising methods, and increasing the quality of our socialization programs to strengthen our bond as Mapuans. I'm happy to report that we have started many initiatives to achieve these objectives and are seeing successes with them.

Our Annual Summer Family Picnic and Membership Drive was a huge success. We had a record attendance of over 110 people despite the pandemic. The big attendance was largely due to the outreach by volunteers to alumni friends and Mapua affinity groups.

Mapuans who were new to SCMA or who haven't attended the event in a while were present. The camaraderie was electric. We also saved on expenses as alumni groups and individuals volunteered to pay for the lechon, sponsor the website, and donate the banner and raffle prizes.

At the summer picnic, we started an initiative to increase the number of "New Lifetime Members" by highlighting the benefits of being a lifetime member, presenting them to the general membership and giving them free welcome Mapua T-shirts. I have subsequently called each new Lifetime member, and I can tell you that there is a lot of enthusiasm among these members. They are a special group and they are already helping energize our organization. We introduced the new Lifetime Members at the Christmas Party and will "Pledge" all New Lifetime Members at the upcoming Dinner-Dance. So far this year, we've signed up fourteen (14) new Lifetime members, a recent record.

Our Christmas Party was another huge success. Based on past attendance, we anticipated 50 people, but we had 62 attendees, another recent record. We reached an on-line RSVP goal of 50 people within 2 weeks of the event's announcement, as word spread quickly among Mapua alumni friendship networks. We utilized our new website to organize the event efficiently, including the announcement/flyer, on-line event RSVP, and electronic payments via Zelle and Venmo on the website. The party was so much fun. We introduced our new set of Officers, New Lifetime Members, Past Presidents, and Golf Champions. In attendance were alumni from Class 1961 to 2013 - we did a hilarious Karaoke Caroling contest among three generational groups. We also introduced a new form of fund-raising called the "Scholarship Matching Fund" program. I am humbled by the enthusiastic outpouring of financial support from those present. We received over \$4,000 in tax-deductible donations/pledges, and more are continuing to pour in.

We are currently planning our 45<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Dinner-Dance and Induction Ball which will be held on April 30, 2022 at the Norwalk Doubletree hotel by Hilton. This will be a night to enjoy and remember, so invite your fellow alumni, family and friends, and submit your RSVP and souvenir program ads early. We will have a nice formal dinner and a live band with dancing and live entertainment. We will be inducting our new set of officers, pledging our new lifetime members, and honoring past presidents who founded SCMA in 1977. We are also planning a Mapua Golf Tournament, a bowling outing, a California EIT Exam review class, and other activities. Please monitor our website and mark these events in your calendar.

I feel that the ball is now rolling in the direction of a newly-revitalized SCMA. ## **SCMA Scholarship Matching Fund (SMF):**

One of our most important missions is helping poor but smart students studying at our beloved Alma Mater to complete their education through our Scholarship Partnership program at Mapua University. Due to the pandemic, we had not been able to raise funds as our scheduled fundraisers in 2020 (dinner-dance, golf, casino trips, etc.) were canceled. The need to help these students is greater than ever. As Mapua alumni in Southern California, we are so blessed, and I know that we are looking for a way to share our blessings with them. As such, we have created a program for us to make direct donations to the SCMA Scholarship fund. 
date, she has not completed the two requirements necessary for graduation. Hopefully, as the restrictions ease up, she'll be able to finish and graduate.

The Scholarship Matching Fund promises a brighter outlook for the scholarship program this coming year. With the assistance of Eden Brasileno, Financial Assistance Officer of the Center for Scholarship and Financial Assistance at Mapua University, advertisements for SCMA scholarship are now posted at the University to solicit applications from financially needy but deserving students. With sufficient funds, the Scholarship Program will be able to meet its goal of sponsoring two or more students with an annual grant of

\$1,600 (\$400 per quarter) per scholar.

#### **SCMA 2021 Annual Summer Family Picnic:**



This year's annual summer family picnic and membership drive was held at Suzanne Park in Walnut, CA, on August 7, 2021. With an estimated 110+ attendees of both old-timers and young prospective members, it was a very well-attended event, despite the intervening news of the Covid Delta variant. The event was also
