### President's Message

Greetings fellow Mapuans and friends! It's summertime and it's time for us to get together once again as a big happy group. I'm referring to our upcoming SCMA Annual Summer Family Picnic and Membership Drive on August 27 in our beautiful and welcoming city of Walnut. Please spread the word and come with your fellow Mapuan group, friends, and families. This is one of our most important events, and more so this year because we will start nominations for the new set of officers for 2023-2024. Let's make this year's picnic as successful as last year's, where we had over 110 people in attendance and a record number of new annual members, and new lifetime members.

This year, as the pandemic is abating, our organization has become more vibrant than ever. Our 45<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Induction Ball and Dinner-Dance last April 30 at the Norwalk

Doubletree Hilton hotel was a great success. We had a huge attendance – 216 guests, and we raised over \$5,500. We inducted our mostly young set of officers, pledged over 20 new lifetime members, honored our founding presidents and recognized members for their outstanding contributions to the success of the organization, all in a fun and elegant party.

Our golf tournament last June 25 at Alhambra Golf Course was also very successful after being in hiatus for 4 years. It was great to see our golfer alumni and friends, networking and having quality time at the golf course and the after-game dinner at Kami Buffet in Rosemead. We had 16 teams and we played Texas Best-ball Scramble. Congratulations to the winners of the Championship, 1st and 2nd Runner-up, Longest Drive and Closest-to-the-Pin trophies, as well as the putting contest and raffle prize winners. With special thanks to our sponsors and volunteers, we're happy to report that this fundraiser generated about \$2,600. Also, we are in the process of organizing two teams to compete against other Southern California Alumni groups. As you may know, we won the "Battle of the Alma Mater" tournament last year.

The traditional methods of raising funds have been augmented by new ones, including the Adopt-A-Scholar, Qualified Charitable Distribution, Scholarship Matching Fund, and Facebook Birthday Programs. The response to these programs, especially the Scholarship Matching Fund, has been quite good and we've increased our Scholarship Fund reserve to about \$20,000. One of our scholars has graduated and the other is near graduation. We are now in the process of on-boarding four (4) new scholars at our Alma Mater.

We are organizing a free Engineer-in-Training (EIT) course this fall to help our members and other engineers in their professional development. Let us know if someone you know would like to review for and take the California EIT board exam. Also let us know if you can teach a subject, offer to host a class, or if you have any ideas to help improve this course.

Our website has proven to be quite useful in automating the functions we used to do on paper, including membership application/renewal, event announcement/invitation, on-line payment/donation, messaging, and dissemination of information such as our mission/vision, membership/leadership, scholarship and career assistance programs, fundraising programs, and alumni life activities. ### **Membership Status and Membership Drive**

After a year of hiatus (2020) due to this pandemic, SCMA saw a surge in membership in 2021 – twenty-one (21) new lifetime and seven (7) new annual-paying members, which has not happened in over 20 years. This can be attributed to the following reasons: (A) An energetic president who reached out to former co-workers, relatives, friends, business and community associates; (B) Our new website that fostered new interest and excitement in SCMA and made on-line membership applications easy and convenient; (C) Active recruitment by fellow alumni and classmates, and; (D) Promotional incentives such as a free Mapua T-shirt for new lifetime members and formal recognition at the dinner-dance event. To date, the total number of lifetime members is 128 and annual-paying members is 41.

Our annual family picnic and general membership meeting also serves as our annual membership drive. This year, the picnic will be held in Walnut, CA on Saturday, August 27. We are again promoting Lifetime Memberships with the same incentives plus a payment plan. Lifetime Membership reduces work on annual renewals on both the member and SCMA and ensures inclusion of the member's name in the dinner dance souvenir programs and the website for life. #### **SCMA Free EIT Review Course This Fall**

One of SCMA's core missions is to provide career advancement assistance with free California Engineering Exam review classes, mentoring, networking, and job placement support to individuals in the engineering and technical fields. Engineerin-Training (EIT) review classes for young engineers and alumni aspiring to pass the Fundamentals of Engineering exam and be granted a California EIT Certificate is one of the most popular of SCMA's public service programs. A review course typically consists of eight classes held on consecutive Saturdays and is scheduled when there are sufficient number of students. This fall, SCMA plans to conduct the EIT review classes, which will be facilitated by SCMA members and volunteers who have passed the exam and/or have a mastery of specific subject areas. We are now in the process of organizing the course and are looking for students and instructors. This year, we hope to be able to partner with organizations such as companies, government agencies and universities, and utilize technology to improve this program. ### SCMA's Four (4) New Scholars

SCMA is adding four (4) new scholars to our Mapua University Scholarship Program. We received fifteen (15) applications from Mapua's Scholarship and Financial Assistance Office in February 2022. Upon the request of the President to select three scholars per SCMA's process, our Scholarship Committee sprang into action and reviewed the applications remotely. Each member of the committee provided their individual score sheets, and the ratings were tabulated by the Scholarship Committee chairperson, Ms. Cecilia Lopez-Brod. The results were provided to SCMA's President prior to our dinner dance event in April 2022. The committee chose Hazella Jae Abanilla (CHE-3), Mel Patrick Malinis (CHE-3), and Nicole Maceda (CHE-3), as the new SCMA scholars. A fourth candidate was also identified as a possible future scholar, Kyla Athena Bermundo (CE-3).

The "Adopt-A-Scholar" program was recently activated when SCMA lifetime members Ms. Cynthia De Leon, PE, and Ms. Rosalinda J. Tandoc, PE, expressed interest to the President in adopting a scholar. They agreed to take Kyla Athena Bermundo, as their scholar. Also, as part of the earlier Qualified Charitable Donation (QCD) Program, Mr. & Mrs. Dan Nable's level of donation this year entitled them to choose a scholar that they could adopt. Among the three scholars selected by the Scholarship Committee, they chose to adopt Nicole Maceda. To adopt a scholar under the Adopt-A-Scholar program, the Sponsor(s) should have the intention in making sufficient donations for supporting their scholar to the same level as SCMA's support (\$400 per quarter) until he/she graduates, and make donations for at least two (2) quarters in advance. ### **SCMA Fundraising Program Boosted Our Finances**

We are proud to announce that our traditional and new fundraising programs since the pandemic have generated amounts that exceed recent records. The Scholarship Matching Fund (SMF) was kicked off last Christmas Party on December 4, 2021, and was based on work done by Ross Papilla, President and Joe Rigonan, Former President. This new program allows donors to contribute directly to the SCMA Scholarship Fund and their donations are matched by patrons, thus allowing maximum impact of their donations while getting a tax deduction. To date there are 21 donations, and this program has raised \$6,325.

In January 2022, Ross Papilla, President. and Dan Nable, Former President, initiated a process whereby a retiree withdrawing his/her annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) can assign part of the RMD to a non-profit organization as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). This program was recently approved by IRS and is non-taxable. This provides significant tax savings to the donor while benefiting SCMA. We've had a substantial donation from Dan & Melanie Nable in the amount of \$5,000. We are very grateful for such a large donation. This is a win-win situation, and we are looking for more donors who qualify for this program.

The new Adopt-A-Scholar Program was activated when BFF SCMA members Cynthia De Leon and Rosalinda Tandoc approached Ross Papilla, President on April 30, 2022, about "adopting" a specific SCMA scholar. To date, they have donated \$1,600 and more will come. We welcome more adoptive sponsors on this program.

Our traditional Dinner-Dance fundraiser raised a net \$5,510 at our 45<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Dinner-Dance last April 30<sup>th</sup> from souvenir program ad sales, dinner tickets, and raffles. 50% of this amount was transferred to the Scholarship Fund. In addition, our recently completed SCMA Golf Tournament last June 25<sup>th</sup> was a fun-filled event for players and volunteers. SCMA raised \$2,586 from sponsorship donations and player fees. Special thanks to Nene Umali-Irlandez for soliciting numerous donations.

From January 1, 2021, to date, our general fund doubled from \$13,560 to \$24,580, and our scholarship fund grew four-fold from \$4,827 to \$19,530. A big "thank you" to our members and supporters. Your generosity will change the lives of not only our scholars and other beneficiaries, but the positive effect of your good deed will extend through time.
